

KASH Newsletter - 1st quarter of 2025

As we are now in March of 2025, it is time to look back at everything that the KASH Youth Projects Foundation has done in 2024 and to look ahead at what is planned for the current year. Because in addition to travelling to Kenya in July this year, we are of course going to organise plenty of exciting activities in the Netherlands!

In the first quarter of 2025, we have not organised any activities yet. However, behind the scenes we have certainly not been idle! For instance, we are busy preparing for the trip, of course. In the process, we are in close contact with our partners in Kenya: the APDK clinic in Mombasa and the Oyiengo primary school in Kisumu. Recap of 2024

But first, let's look back on the past year, in which a lot of activity took place. For instance, we had the Easter lunch, plant market, beach day, Christmas market - our traditional yearly events. In addition to these, we also provided a church service last year, we started cooperating with pop choir Brand New Voices and undertook two duo bike trips with senior citizens.

In 2024 we organised:

- On 16 March and 11 June we held duo bike trips with seniors. It was a truly social, connecting activity, which was very much enjoyed by both the seniors and the participants from KASH!
- On 30 March, we organised an **Easter lunch**. It was great fun and the food was delicious.
- A **KASH** church service on 21 April. We were given the opportunity to perform a church service in our very own way at the Bethlehem Church (the protestant Church in our city, Helmond). A truly inspiring day!
- On 11 May, we held a **plant market**. By taking cuttings of plants as well as upcycling, we were able to sell many different plants and (garden) products at this market. All in all, a very fun springtime event!
- On 24 August, we hosted a **beach day** for senior citizens. A day out to Scheveningen beach, fully catered for. All clearly enjoyed themselves very much!



- On 18 October there was a **tasting evening**. A new concept where we featured our well-known products but also new ones, both food and drink. It was well received by the guests!
- A collaboration with pop choir Brand New Voices followed on 30 November. As a partner, we were allowed to give away tickets to their anniversary concert. The lucky winners had a lovely evening!
- On 7 December it was time for the Christmas market. Like every year, the Christmas market turned out to be another great success. Once again, we offered a wide range of products with many homemade Christmas items.
- On 31 December, we made and sold 'oliebollen', a Dutch snack that is served at every New Year's Eve party. In the end we made more than 900!



Working together with Kenyan students

Kenyan students Felix and Esther further strengthened our team when they joined us in 2024. They are affiliated with the Kenya Marine and Fisheries Research Institute (KMFRI) and Bigship. On behalf of KASH and APDK, they are conducting (market) research in Mombasa on planting Mangroves for environmental, climate and coastal protection and are designing solar cookers



to reduce the use of waste and mangrove wood for cooking. The material is instead turned into useful products, such as solar cooker parts and school materials, such as chairs and tables.

The aim is that this work will generate many opportunities for local employment, including for the Bombolulu social and cultural work centre, which is part of APDK.

Felix and Esther will also join us on our working trip in July this year. We will join them and all locally involved partners and community members in planting 10,000 mangroves on 10 July. We operate with a project plan and agreements signed by the involved institutions and are partly financially supported by Wilde Ganzen Foundation and other sponsors.

Activities in 2025
